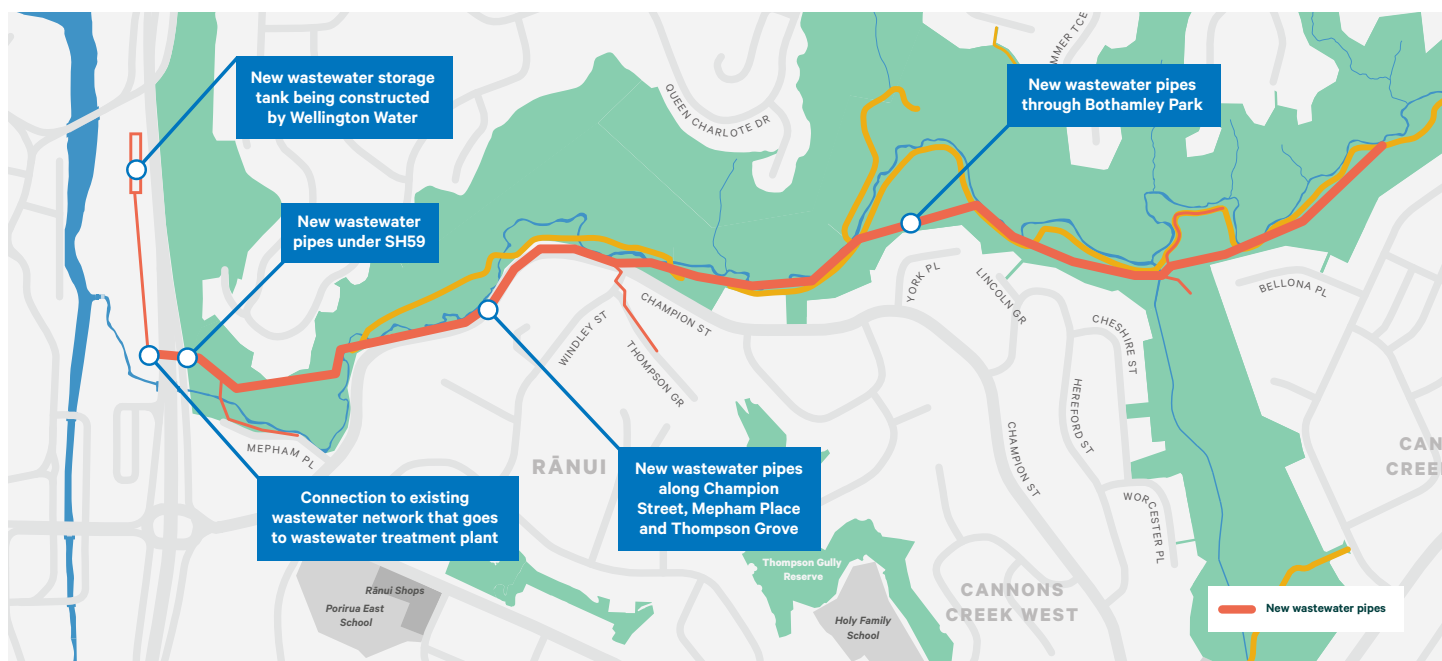
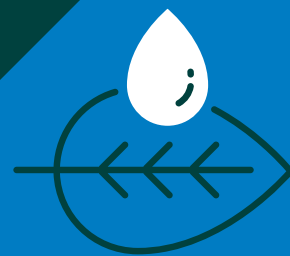


# Bothamley Park Wastewater pipes upgrade



Over the next 20 years Porirua Development will deliver more new quality homes for the people of Porirua, as well as contribute to the wellbeing and health of the community through work to improve roads, waterways and reserves.

To help improve our environment and support the new homes being built, we are upgrading 3km of old wastewater pipes that run through Bothamley Park. Work is scheduled to begin in December 2022 and will take approximately three years to complete.

## Why are we doing this?

The community have told us that the health of te taiao (the environment) is important to them. Upgrading the pipes through Bothamley Park is one way we can achieve this.

The current wastewater pipes through the park are in poor condition and regularly overflow when it rains because they are not big enough. This upgrade will improve the water quality of Kenepuru Stream and Te Awarua o Porirua.

These new pipes, along with the wastewater storage tank being constructed beside SH59, will prevent approximately 40,000m<sup>3</sup> of raw sewage from overflowing into our waterways each year. That's enough to fill 16 Olympic swimming pools!

The new pipes are better for our environment and the health of our community. They will enable new homes in the areas and create opportunities for other improvements to be made to Bothamley Park.

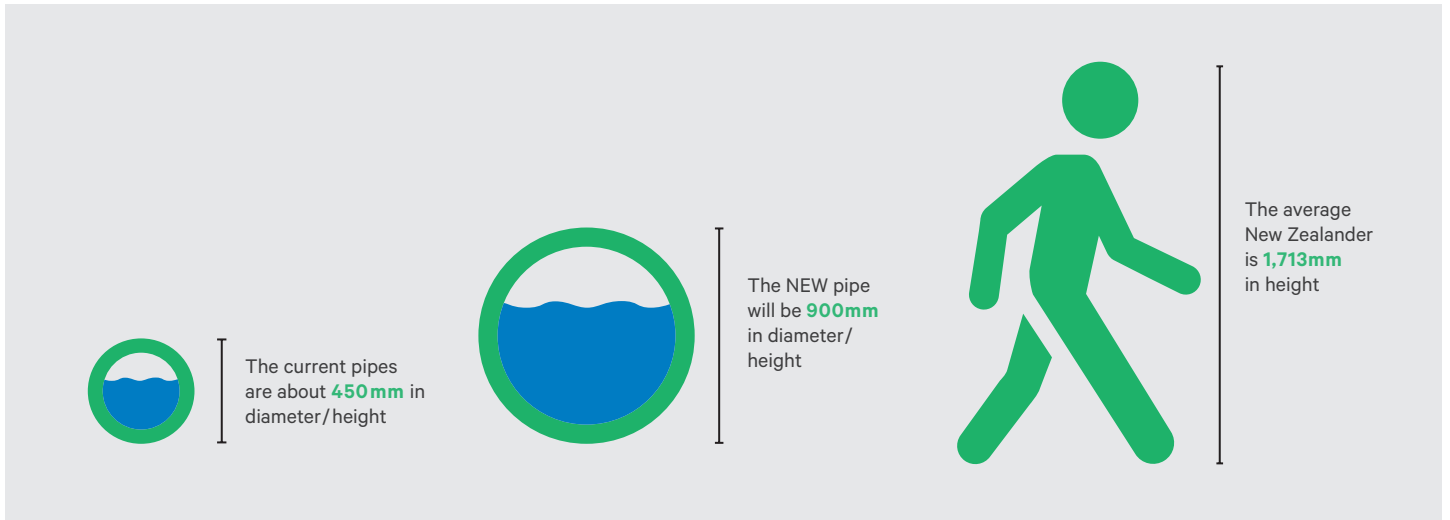

## Key things you need to know

- The main track from the Champion Street carpark to the blackberry harvest area will need to close for approximately 2 years from the beginning of 2023.
- Parts of the park will close for short periods of time but there will always be parts of the park open for walking, cycling and for the community to enjoy.
- We will work with Porirua City Council, Waka Kotahi and others to minimise noise, dust and traffic disruption as well as to keep the community safe while we upgrade the wastewater pipes.
- For local residents who live close to the park and are more impacted by the works, we will make sure you know ahead of time of the upcoming works.
- To complete this work as safely and quickly as possible, we will need to remove some of the pine trees through Bothamley Park. This provides an opportunity to landscape and replant key areas within the park.
- We will work closely with the community and our development partners, Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Porirua City Council, to create something that meets today's aspirations and is also sustainable for future generations.

## Who is doing the work?

Porirua Development is a partnership between Kāinga Ora, Porirua City Council and Ngāti Toa Rangatira. To remove and replace the wastewater pipes, Porirua Development have contracted Te Aranga Alliance. Te Aranga is a partnership of civil and infrastructure experts Higgins, Goodmans, Beca, Harrison Grierson and Orogen.
