

Project Director's update

It's great to be back operating as business as usual. For the Porirua Development, it also means we can get back to having more meaningful face-to-face engagements, as your thoughts and feedback are valuable to us. We have a couple of key pieces of engagement coming up this year, so keep your eyes peeled for more information.

Progress on Esk Place and Niger Street is well under way. Te Aranga have been busy preparing our construction sites to help us deliver more warmer, drier and safer homes for Cannons Creek. You may have also noticed new Porirua Development and Te Aranga fencing signage around the sites on Castor Crescent.

We also have a few smaller developments underway throughout eastern Porirua, with many more in the pipeline. We've recently submitted resource consent has to build eight new 6-Homestar rated homes on Maher Street in Rānui. These smaller development sites will play a key role in bringing more warmer, drier homes to the area.

Housing that makes a real difference

Maena and Joe were living in public housing along a steep bank in Titahi Bay.

The land was hard to use which meant Joe couldn't do what he loved the most – gardening. When the opportunity to move to a brand new accessible home in Morere Street arose, the grandparents jumped at the opportunity.

"We are very grateful for what we have now. You've built these beautiful home that are comfortable and warm, and the best part about these is my husband is able to plant again" Maena says at the blessing at the completion of the Morere Street development. Maena and Joe live in one of the 12 homes that have recently been completed by Kāinga Ora. "In our previous home, it was difficult to move around and it had lots of stairs" says Maena.

Their new two bedroom home, is on a flat land, making it easy to move around. They've been able their own vegetable garden and relaxation area making for more fulfilled living.

Kāinga Ora have recently completed and handed over the final three of 12 new warmer, drier homes in Morere Street, Titahi Bay. The new homes will be managed by Te Āruhu Mōwai, local iwi group Ngāti Toa Rangatira housing agency.

These homes are part of the partnership agreement between the crown and Ngāti Toa Rangatira which sees, Te Āruhu Mōwai, local iwi group Ngāti Toa Rangatira housing agency lease and manage over 900 homes in western Porirua. This transfer of housing also enables Porirua Development to build more housing in eastern Porirua.

Following the completion of three 5-bedroom homes in the development, a small blessing was held before the new families moved in.

"My hope is that when the final tenants move it, we will be able to create community gathering every month. There are lots of children here and my mokopuna also come after school" says Maena. "Fruit trees bloom really well and families have been able to exchange fruit creating a real sense of community".

We're excited that the first part of the new community space project has been delivered to The Cage on Bedford Street.

Over the coming weeks we will be working with local rangatahi, youth workers, schools and community groups to help turn this box into a space where our rangatahi and whānau can easily access sports and play equipment. 
We want to do this as safely and quickly as possible.

Sports-mad, family & turangawaewae.


Meet the Mayor
